Take a look at this fantastic Animoto created by 3 students at Highland Elementary. Great work Kasey, Ben, Cameron, and Mrs. Rowe!

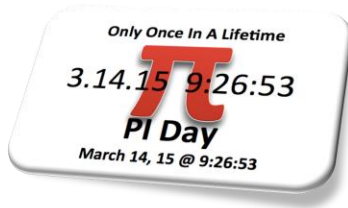

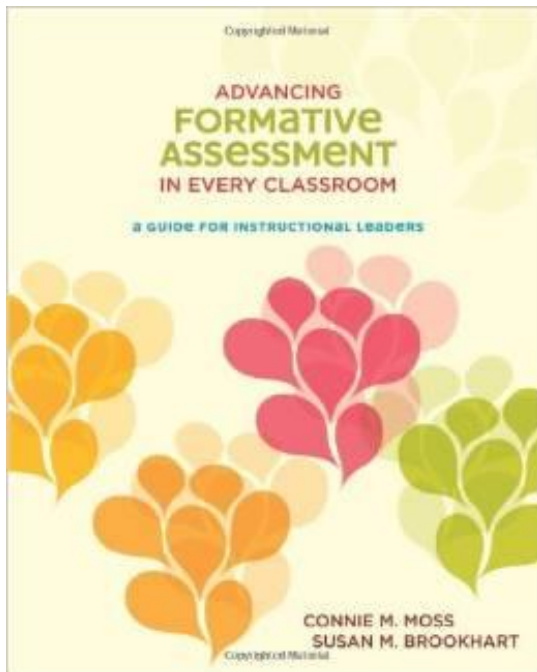
Repeat [Excel Commands](#) by Jeff Coots

New Advancing Formative Assessment in Every Classroom: A Guide for Instructional Leaders A recommendation by Jennifer Carroll

Formative assessment, when used effectively, can have two very significant benefits: improve student achievement and raise teacher quality. This book is a resource for school leaders to help guide their work with teachers to make the formative assessment process an embedded process in their

classrooms. The book is organized for school leaders, school teams, and collaborative groups to use as a “guide” to develop and implement highly effective formative assessment practices that promote student and school achievement. The book very deliberately defines ways that information about learning is utilized by the most important people in this process—the students.

The first step in formative assessment is being clear about and sharing learning targets and criteria for success. Moss and Brookhart provide specific strategies that a principal might share with a teacher who does not know how to do this or does not do this effectively. For instance, teachers might ask students to put the learning targets in their own words and then make planning charts to keep track of their progress toward the learning targets. The book provides some sample walkthrough guides that an instructional leader might use to observe and provide feedback to teachers about their implementation of learning targets and success criteria.

Effective feedback affects student learning in multiple ways. Descriptive feedback supports student achievement, as students are able to discern where they are in relation to the learning targets and then take the defined next steps to improve their work. Feedback also helps students move from misconceptions to clearer understanding. Effective feedback also shows students how to look at their own work using criteria (i.e., rubric) and to self assess and develop self- assessment skills. Moss and Brookhart provide specific talking points and strategies that an instructional leader could provide to a teacher about the timing, amount, mode and audience in relation to feedback. The book also goes on to provide instructional leaders with guidance in how they support teachers in the content of feedback (focus, function, comparison, valence, clarity, specificity, and tone). The learning is also taken to the next level in that the authors provide support to the principal or other instructional leader in how to model effective feedback in conversations with teachers about their own professional learning/practice.

An entire chapter is devoted to Enhancing Classroom Discourse. As teachers look for ways they can improve questioning which is a component of the Kentucky Framework for Teaching (3b), this chapter provides ideas about questioning that help students reflect on and analyze their existing knowledge and experiences to create new understandings. Again, strategic talking points help guide conversations with teachers to improve this element of formative assessment.

This book is unique in that it fits a variety of audiences. Instructional leaders can use the book to learn and reflect on strategies and talking points they could provide to teachers to help hone these sound elements of formative assessment. Teachers could utilize this resource to analyze their own formative assessment practices and identify specific ways they can improve in critical areas of formative assessment such as learning targets, feedback or questioning. As districts pursue professional learning experiences that will have an impact on student learning and teaching quality, this resource might be one that professional learning communities, departments, or principal cadres consider for review, reflection, and action.
